## **Materials:**

- The to be made amount of bath caviar or bath salt
- A large mixing cup for bath caviar (1 L)
- A small mixing cup for Sodium bicarbonate (250 ml)
- A stirrer
- The necessary amount of Sodium bicarbonate (25 50 g per kg)
- Cosmetic colorant on water base for the desired color strength (0,5%-1,0%)
- Fragrance oil for pour soap for the desired fragrance strength (30 to 60 drops per kg)

## Manual:

- Put the to be made amount of bath caviar or bath salt in the large mixing cup. In case some grains stick together, you can squeeze them from each other.
- Add the necessary amount of Sodium bicarbonate in the small mixing cup.
- Add the cosmetic colorant drop by drop and stir well.
- Possibly repeat this step until the desired color strength is reached.
- Please note! The color of the Sodium bicarbonate needs to be a few shades darker than the to color to be made.
- Keep stirring until the mixture has a nice and uniform color.
- Add the coloured Sodium bicarbonate to the (still) white bath caviar or salt.
- Stir well until the colour is completely absorbed by the bath caviar/salt. Please note that the grains at the bottom are coloured as well.
- Add the necessary amount of fragrance oil.
- Stir the mixture well. Your bath caviar/salt is ready!
- Color tip: Red + yellow = orange

Blue + red = purple Blue + yellow = green
